## What is Allied Health?

Allied Health is a term used to describe the broad range of health professionals who are not doctors, dentists or nurses. In fact, allied health professionals make up the second largest health workforce after nurses.

## What is an Allied Health Assistant?

An Allied Health Assistant works under the supervision of an allied health professional. Their job role will depend on the discipline of their supervisor, who could be anything from a dietician or an occupational therapist to a podiatrist. While some Allied Health Assistants only work within one discipline, many work across disciplines.
